

OPEN SOURCE COMMUNITY INNOVATION AWARDS

US \$1 MILLION DOLLARS

Sun will award more than US \$1 Million through six open source communities. Awards will be paid in August 2008. Each community has its own rules and judging criteria.

The OpenSolaris community is sponsoring two awards programs: a contest and student research grants. The \$100K contest welcomes both code and non-code entries for one \$30K grand prize, three \$15K first prizes, and 25 \$1K second prizes. The \$75K undergraduate student research grant program will be awarded as \$3-5K each for winning proposals, with the research reports due in December 2008.
