Recognized Organizations in Europe (only 3!)

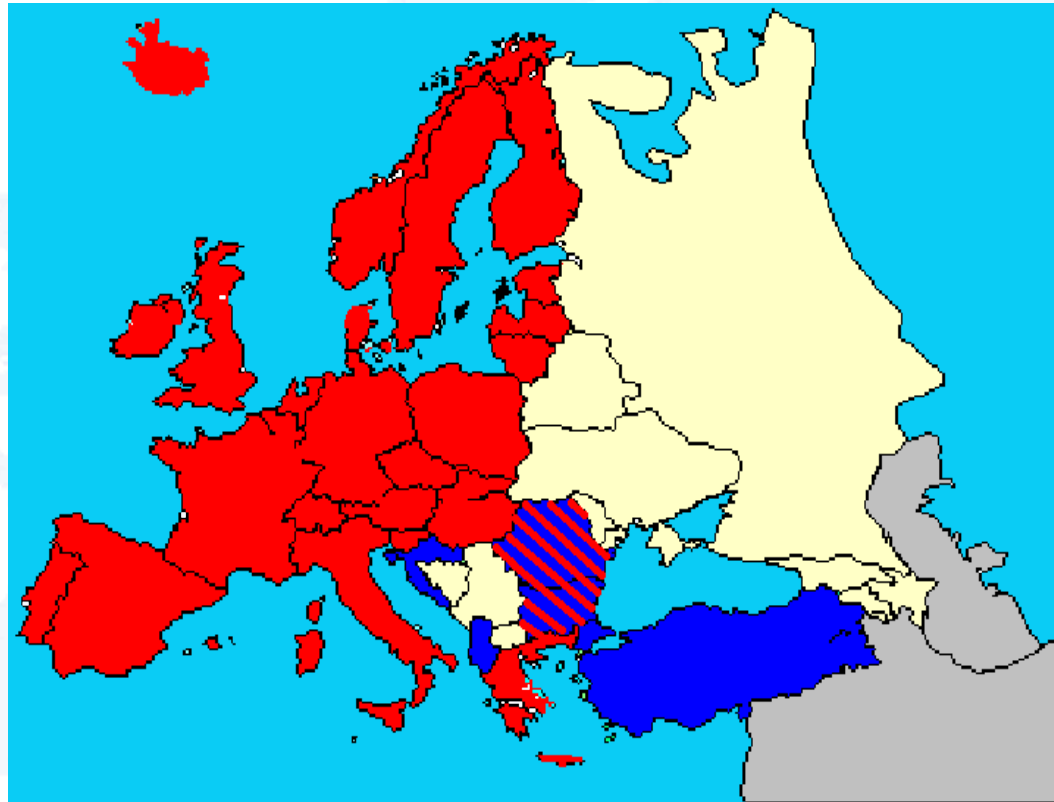
- CEN
European Committee for Standardization
 - Covers a lot of sectors

- CENELEC
European Committee for Electro-Technical Standardization
 - Covers mainly the electro technical sector

- ETSI
European Telecommunications Standards Institute
 - Covers mainly telecommunication and electronic communication networks and services

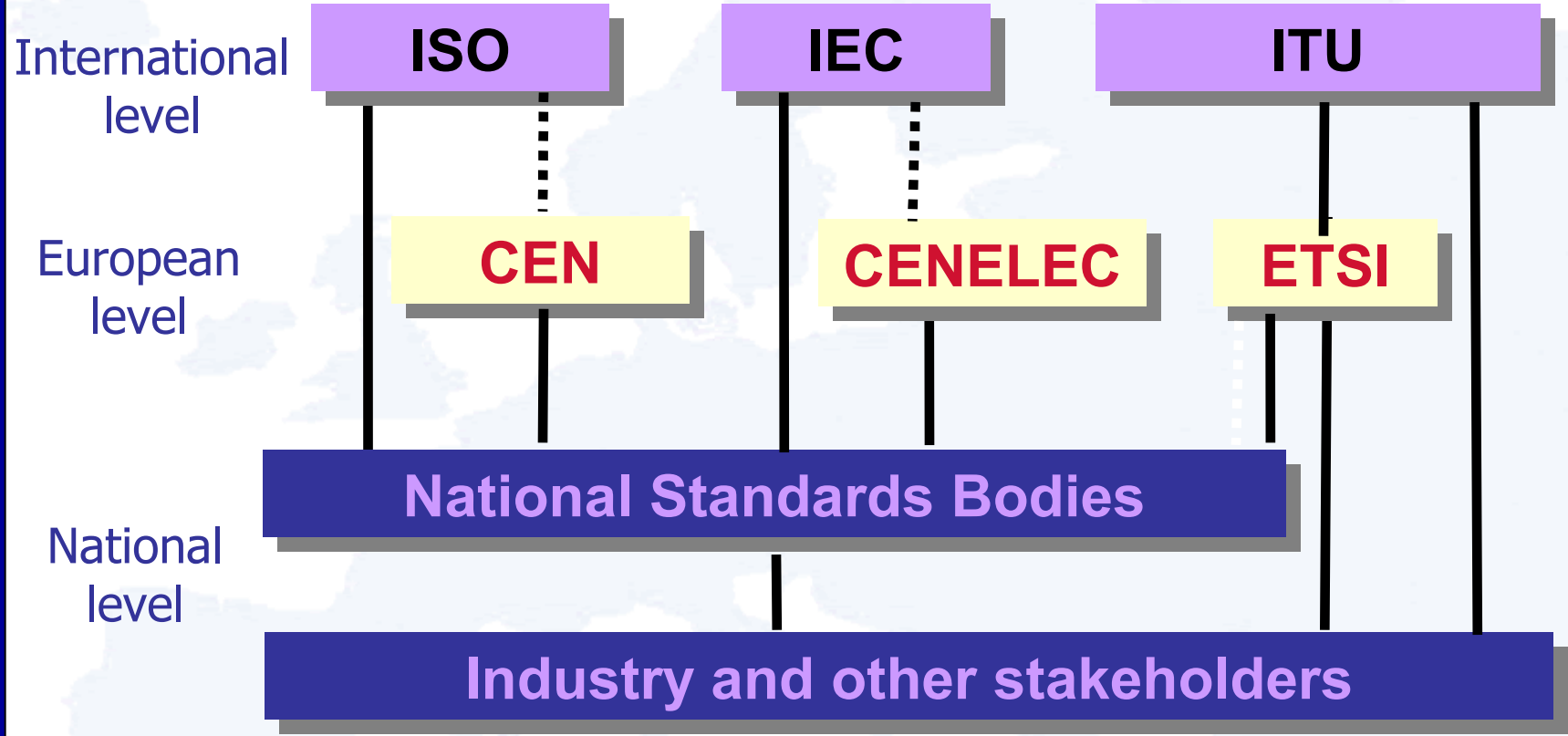


Geography of European Standardization





Standardization is Networking on a Global Level





CENELEC: Close Cooperation with IEC

The Agreement with IEC (“Dresden Agreement”) ensures maximum compatibility of standards on European and International level.

CENELEC will publish its own EN standard only if:

- IEC cannot meet deadlines
- IEC does not want to cooperate in the development of the standard
- IEC does not want to adopt existing / finalized CENELEC EN standards

CENELEC will abstain from adopting a new IEC standard only if:

- Standard does not get sufficient support by members
